**Topic:** Game & Fish Electronic Licensing System

Pat Newbern, President, welcomed everyone and introduced the Wyoming ARMA Chapter Board and guests. Pat announced we will be collecting food for Needs and items to prepare boxes for soldiers through the Yellow Ribbon Program. Packages must be mailed by December 4, 2009. The December meeting is tentatively set for December 3, 2009 at Jackson's restaurant, with a possible ornament exchange.

Pat introduced our speaker, Richard Reynders, Dept. of Game and Fish.

Mr. Reynders gave a very interesting and informative presentation of the Game and Fish Electronic Licensing System. The Electronic Licensing System project was started in 1992 and should be completed in June of 2010. There were 14 test sales locations used for startup, they provided comments and suggestions. In September 2009 internet sales opened. Starting in June of 2010 boat registration can be renewed on-line. Boats have to be titled starting in January 2010. Richard discussed the space, paper and man hours saved by going electronic. In the past Game and Fish hired 48 temporary workers working two shifts. In 2007 40% of the applications were done on line, in 2008, 60% and in 2009, 72%. Richard discussed the application process. They are working on resident and non-resident parties with a goal of 2011. He also explained the quota split, stating 67% of the tags go to Wyoming residents; however, the sale of non-resident tags brings in 70% of the total revenue. From September 1, 2009 through October 20, 2009 there have been over 18,000 internet sales. One advantage of the on-line licensing is you can print multiple copies of your license. Every security measure is taken and the Game and Fish firewall is more secure than the state's. Game and Fish does not store credit card data and the information is encrypted. The system is monitored daily for hackers. Currently 50 GIG of storage is used for Electronic Licensing.
